



2023 Columbus Community High School Scholarships Community Foundation of Louisa County

- 1. Bishop Educational Trust Scholarship:** A select number of scholarships awarded to students who have the desire to attend college in the state of Iowa but need financial assistance in pursuing their educational goals. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and are required to submit their FAFSA SAR report or their parents most recent income tax return. Applicants must attend a college or university in the state of Iowa with a preference given to students attending Muscatine Community College.
- 2. Lisle (Doc) and Jeanette Luithly Scholarship:** A \$500 scholarship award for a graduating senior of Columbus Community High School enrolling full-time at an accredited post-secondary educational institution with the purpose of earning credits for a bachelor's degree. To be eligible, applicants must demonstrate: a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, financial need, be a member of the National Honor Society, and participation in extra-curricular high school activities, volunteer or community service, or employment experience. The family of Lisle (Doc) Luithly established this scholarship award for a graduating senior of Columbus Community High School to honor the memory of Doc Luithly, a long time Columbus Wildcat fan and Southeast Iowa Conference Secretary.
- 3. Michel's Family Educational Trust Scholarship:** A select number of scholarships awarded to students who have the desire and ability to attend college but may need financial support. Recipient must attend Muscatine Community College or Drake University. Applicants must demonstrate financial need and are required to submit their FAFSA SAR report or their parents most recent income tax return.
